

# Join the Global BDS Action Day 30 March 2009

Launched at the World Social Forum Belém-Brazil, 2009

### Why BDS?

Boycott Divestment and Sanctions (BDS) is fast emerging as the required strategy to stop Israel's apartheid policies against the Palestinian people. After decades of forced dispossession, occupation and injustice, BDS is the civil-society initiated answer to the failure of governments to hold Israel accountable for its action. The non-implementation of Palestinian national rights as recognized by countless UN resolutions and human rights conventions necessitates that a proactive approach be taken to stop the machinery which sustains and facilitates Israel's actions politically, militarily, and economically. # Why March 30th?

- March 30 is known as Land Day to Palestinians. The date refers to the bloody killings on the same day in 1976, when the Israeli government issued land confiscation orders for property belonging to Palestinian citizens of Israel. When the community organized a general strike to protest yet another confiscation of their land, armed forces were sent in to the striking villages killing 6, injuring 96 and arresting more than 300 protesters.
- Land Day has come to symbolize the Palestinian attachment to their land despite repeated Israeli government campaigns of "Judaization". It takes on special relevance today because it relates to the heart of why BDS is a necessary strategy: to protest against Israeli discrimination, to resist ongoing theft of Palestinian land and to end the ongoing forced displacement of the Palestinian people.

## **What You Can Do:**

### **Engage in Direct Action:**

- Protest in front of an Israeli or international company profiting from Israeli occupation and apartheid (See the Carmel Agrexco blockade in the UK: http://www.bdsmovement.net/?q=node/13 or the Qatar students campaign: http://www.bdsmovement.net/?q=node/276)
- Protest government policies: Demand sanctions against Israel and the suspension of Free-Trade Agreements with it (See the Norwegian protest of government backed promotion of Israeli economy: http://www.bdsmovement.net/?q=node/214)
- Picket supermarkets and shops selling Israeli products (See the Tesco "citizens seizure" at: http://www.youtube.com/watch?gl=GB&hl=en-GB&v=f729KqURQc4)
- Protests in front of and during sportive and cultural events where Israeli teams or groups are involved and boycott these events (http://www.bdsmovement.net/?q=node/280)

### **Raise Awareness:**

- Organize a BDS-seminar or study day to learn more about Israel's oppression of the Palestinian people and how BDS can work where you are. The strategic position paper of the Palestinian Boycott, Divestment and Sanctions National Committee (BNC) is a useful starting point for this purpose: http://bdsmovement.net/?q=node/222
- Organize conferences about BDS in universities, municipalities, trade unions, etc., that have relations with Israeli companies and institutions
- Distribute leaflets, stickers and posters calling for BDS

### **Propose Resolutions:**

- Put forward a BDS resolution in your local union, party, organization, or civic body. Ensure the motion contains steps towards concrete actions in terms of research, promotion of BDS and/or cutting ties with Israeli interests. - Target the links between your local governing body and Israeli apartheid, by pushing motions to divest from or stop contracts with Israeli companies or international companies profiting from Israeli apartheid/occupation (see the "Caterpillar-free cities" initiative at http://electronicintifada.net/v2/article3746.shtml or the BDS motion of Sor Trodelag, Norway at http://www.stopthewall.org/worldwideactivism/1061.shtml)

### **Media Matters:**

- Work with mainstream media to cover the global BDS Action Day
- Schedule and prepare programs on BDS for local mainstream and alternative media
- Prepare accessible press kits on BDS including statements (your own and those of the movement), contact persons, and well-worded, clear quotations easily usable by a journalist or media outlet.
- Produce your own press of your activities (videos, images and articles) and disseminate them through the internet (video: youtube, dailymotion; images: flickr, picasa and written: blogs, op-eds in local papers, activist/ solidarity websites)

# **Lobby Your Representative:**

- Call for a lobbying day with your representative (See the Indian lobbying initiative against arms trade: http://stopthewall.org/worldwideactivism/1617.shtml or the specially effective lobbying days organized in the UK by the Palestine Solidarity Campaign (PSC): http://www.palestinecampaign.org/Index7b.asp?m\_id=1&I1\_id=6&I2\_id=57&Content\_ID=346
- Raise the issue of institutions and companies that profit from and keep relations with Israeli apartheid in lobbying meetings (See the Derail Veolia Campaign: http://bdsmovement.net/?q=node/304)
